Leona is deeply committed to Indigenous education with the goal of equity and promoting culture and language across all schools.

Since joining SD91, Leona's leadership has led to a District Equity Scan, the creation of a new Diversity 8 course and Indigenous website, increased Indigenous culture and language programming across our schools and supporting a group of lead SD91 educators in deepening their Aboriginal Education practice.

Outside of her formal role with Nechako Lakes School District, Leona is a celebrated author of published children's books as well as a sought-after presenter at numerous provincial events. Leona has been a professional collaborator with many provincial organizations and school districts including Focused Education, OpenSchoolsBC and the FNESC Curriculum Team. Leona is also passionate about becoming fluent in her own language and is continuing her learning through participation as a student in the NVIT Nedut'en Fluency Degree Program.

In 2017, she was awarded the Alumni of the Year award for Professional Excellence by the Alumni Association of UNBC, her alma mater. In 2018, Leona also received an Indspire Award for Educational Leadership.

In this new position, Leona will join the senior leadership team to enhance the district's journey and commitment to improving the education and lives of all learners through Truth and Reconciliation and the Calls to Action.
